Full details regarding the registration of a ticket name are contained in The Australian National University Students' Association Constitution and Election Regulations.

A summary of the requirements is as follows:

The Returning Officer will maintain a register of ticket names for each year's annual elections.

Ticket registrations must be lodged between 9am, Wednesday 21 August 2024 and 5pm, Wed 11 September 2024

Ticket registration forms are to be lodged by email to sa.admin@anu.edu.au

Applications to register ticket names, signed by 5 or more ordinary members of the Association, will be accepted by the Returning Officer during the registration period. Only those ticket names that have been duly registered will appear on ballot papers. No person is entitled to apply for registration of a ticket name if that person has already applied for the registration of another ticket. No person is entitled to apply to the Returning Officer for registration of a ticket name if that person was a signatory to an application to register a ticket name for another ticket already entered in the register.

The proposed ticket name must not:

- be more than 90 characters long (including spaces);
- be obscene, defamatory, sexist, racist or homophobic or otherwise discriminatory;
- be the same as the name of another registered ticket name;
- be so nearly the same as the name of another registered ticket name that it is likely to be confused or mistaken for that name; or
- include the word "independent".

If a registered ticket endorses more candidates for election to a position than there are vacancies to be filled, all nominations from that ticket for that position shall be rejected.

Legal obligations of nominees

Nominees should also consider whether they are disqualified from running for office by S63, 63A and 63B, of the Associations Act 1991 (ACT). The following people may be disqualified from holding office on ANUSA by legislation (unless they have obtained leave from the Supreme Court of the ACT):

- · Those convicted of an indictable offence in relation to the promotion, formation or management of a company within the past 5 years.
- Those convicted of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty punishable by imprisonment for a period of 3 months or more within the past 5 years.
- · Those who are bankrupt or personally insolvent.

Please note that the maximum penalty for non-compliance with these provisions is 50 penalty units (\$8000), imprisonment for 6 months, or both. If you have concerns about your eligibility under these provisions, please reach out to sa.principallawyer@anu.edu.au for a confidential appointment.
