Item 3: Executive Reports

3.1 President's report (B. Gill)

- University Medal
 - In the College of Science, you are eligible for a University Medal if you average over 95%
 - College of Science holds that al students who meet this requisite ought to be awarded the Medal
 - College of Arts and Social Sciences tend only to award only the top students in each discipline/cohort
 - Getting over 95% in CASS is nigh impossible most of the time, unlike in Science where there are right and wrong answers
- CRC Feedback
 - From now on, CRC feedback will not be anonymous
 - At this point in the semester, it is important that representatives are able to communicate like adults and own their behaviour.

4.4 College of Arts and Social Sciences (CASS) (L. Ma)

CASS noted that:

- Linda and Alix had a productive meeting about the PhB Review with CASS Administration
 - o The College is reviewing the programme listings for PhB in future.
- University Medal
 - CASS opposes any reform that would mean students would be required to meet at 95% average
- CASS Education Meeting
 - There is an internal move to stop future mid year entry into Honours
 - o Both Ma and Biggs intend to conduct consultation around this issue

- Issues arising with Course Representative
 - A course representative in a Chinese language course emailed the CAP representatives to let them know that there were issues around staff responses to feedback
 - Course reps were told by teaching staff that their feedback was wrong and staff were not receptive
 - CAP Representatives are in contact with the CAP Associate Dean about the matter
- CAP Societies
 - ANUSA Representatives ran an event where they invited all executives from Clubs and Societies within CAP
 - 27 non-ANUSA Representatives attended and were able to discuss the myriad of different events that they are running
 - Executives are planning to now sharing resources, collaborate and attempt to ensure that their events do not clash
- CAP Mobility
 - o Photo exhibition with Monsoon planned
- Facebook
 - Picking up on Facebook and planning to liaise with ANUSA Communications Officer to ensure that progress continues
