CBE Education Committee Meeting

Teaching for 2023 - The Senior Management Group has decided that ANU will continue with remote teaching in Semester 1, 2023. However, students are expected to be all back on campus from Semester 2, 2023, for face-to-face learning. No announcement has been made so far due to various reasons that must be addressed first. The Committee noted that the absence of a statement to students creates uncertainty.

Feedback sessions were held during the week of 22 August, and unfortunately, only two students registered. However, many emails were received through the feedback form. It is suspected that the low registration might be due to it being early in the semester. The events team has also suggested that the feedback events be rebranded as part feedback and part social events. Further sessions will be held in week 10. ANUSA and PARSA representatives were invited to participate in those sessions.

Following up on Student Concerns

- We have been actively following up on concerns raised by students. There have not been any significant major concerns related to one course in specific. Surprisingly, the issues have been largely found in later year courses.
- We note that some students have successfully resolved concerns relating to this
 assessment by contacting the course convenor directly. We would encourage those
 that feel comfortable doing so to contact the course convenor in the first instance.
- We are also receiving a lot of inquiries about assignment due dates during the public holiday. Currently, there are no rules on submission on public holidays but there are rules in working out the penalties for late submission. This has to be based on working days which does not include public holidays, Saturdays and Sundays.

- Isha has also been actively meeting with Marvin (Director of Students and Learning) and Bronwen to look at course reps, summer courses, and certain recurring course issues.
- Some students also reach out to us through our personal accounts to talk about exam related issues such as applying for deferred examinations. We are more than happy if you are more comfortable reaching us out through social media than formal avenues like email.

Course Feedback

Once again, if any student has any feedback on any courses and does not feel comfortable approaching their convenor or course representatives, feel free to approach us. We have processed a few points of student feedback and just want to reiterate that we are always happy to relay feedback anonymously. Reach out to us via email at sa.cbe@anu.edu.au!

Particular note if there are any incidents which students feel have detracted from their learning experience within courses that anybody would like raised anonymously with course convenors/ the school, we are more than happy to step in to advocate on behalf of the student.
