

# The Australian National University Students' Association Incorporated Annual Elections 2018 – Call for nominations

Nominations are hereby called for election to the following offices and positions.

#### Delegates to the meetings of National Conference of the National Union of Students Incorporated

 5 delegates to the meetings of National Conference of the National Union of Students Inc. Must be elected by and from, and must remain during their term, students represented by a Member Organisation or be full-time Office Bearers of a Member Organisation.

The successful candidates will serve for a term from the commencement of the Annual State Conference immediately following their election until the commencement of the next Annual State Conference following their election.

No student may be elected as a Delegate to the National Conference by the students represented by a member Organisation, where that student has already been elected as a Delegate to the same National Conference by the students of another Member Organisation.

Women's Officer	A candidate for the position of Women's Officer must Self-identify as a woman or woman-aligned and/or; have experienced gendered oppression as a result of being perceived as a woman and/or; Identify as trans and gender diverse and find our services useful regardless of the pronouns they use.	
Queer* Officer	A candidate for the position of Queer* Officer must be openly gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, intersex or queer identifying and an active member of the Queer* Department. Only gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, intersex or queer identifying individuals are eligible to vote for this position.	
Indigenous Officer	A candidate for the position of Indigenous Officer must be an Indigenous student and an active member of the Indigenous Department. Only Indigenous students are eligible to vote for this position.	
<ul> <li>Disabilities Officer (held individually or jointly)</li> </ul>	Only students with a disability shall vote or nominate for the position of Disabilities Officer.	
International Students' Officer	Only international students may vote or nominate for the position of International Students' Officer.	
Ethnocultural Officer	Only those who self-identify as people of colour shall vote or nominate. This includes but is not limited to people who come from a minority ethnocultural background, are white-passing, are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, and have been marked or marginalised by white supremacy	
<ul> <li>2 College Representative positions to the CRC from each College of the University</li> </ul>	Students may only vote or nominate for a College Representative position of a College if they are enrolled in that College. (Note: the ANU College of Physical and Mathematical Sciences and the ANU College of Medicine, Biology and Environment shall together be considered one electorate for the purposes of the election and will elect 2 representatives in total).	

The successful candidates will serve for one year from 1 December 2018.

An ordinary member of the Association is any person enrolled at the ANU as an undergraduate student (including non-award) or enrolled at ANU College and who has not written to the General Secretary of the Association specifically stating that they do not wish to be a member of the Association (Note: under the ANUSA Inc Constitution, the term "undergraduate" excludes Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery students).

**Nomination forms and ticket registration forms** are available from the office of the Association or on the Internet at anusa.com.au. **Ticket registrations must be lodged between 10am, Monday 16 July 2018 and 4pm, Monday 30 July 2018.** 

Applications to register ticket names, signed by 5 or more ordinary members of the Association, will be accepted by the Returning Officer during the registration period. Only those ticket names that have been duly registered will appear on ballot papers. No person is entitled to apply for registration of a ticket name if that person has already applied for the registration of another ticket.

#### Nominations must be lodged between 10am, Monday 16 July 2018 and 4pm, Thursday 2 August 2018

All nomination forms must contain a signed undertaking by the nominee that they will act in the position if elected and will abide by the ANUSA regulations, and must also be signed by two ordinary members of the Association (in addition to the nominee).

Candidates in the election may indicate the ticket with which they are running, or that they are running as an independent. Where a candidate indicates that they are running as a candidate endorsed by a registered ticket, the Returning Officer shall verify this endorsement if at least one of the nominators is a signatory to the application to register the ticket name, or the Returning Officer receives notice of the endorsement from a signatory to the application to register the ticket name.

All nominations must be placed in the locked ballot box provided in the ANUSA office, Melville Hall, between 10am and 4pm on any week day during the period in which nominations are open.

**The order of candidates on the voting ballot will be determined on Friday 3 August 2018 commencing at 10am**, ANUSA & PARSA Boardroom, Melville Hall, Building 12. The order of candidates within a group endorsed by a registered ticket can be specified by that group if the request is received in writing by the Returning Officer before 27 July.

## Online polling will be held during Week 4, opening at 9 Monday 13 August and closing at 4pm on Thursday 16 August.

All undergraduate students will be invited to vote in the online election and may do so from their own laptop, smartphone or tablet. Electronic voting booths will also be made available in the Pop Up Village in accordance with section 2.5.1 of the Election Regulations. Further details about the online election platform will be made available in due course.
