- **1.** SEEF funding that are still pending which amount to \$2,500 and can further break down into:
  - a. International Students' Welcome Evening (Semester 2) \$1,250
  - b. ISD Valedictorian Dinner \$1,250
- **2.** Brian Kenyon Appreciation Barbeque and Surprise Party that going to happen on 17 October 2013 and 24 October 2013. This amount is based on the budget hence might subject to changes.
- **3.** ISD Students' Integration Program (SIP) is still carrying on till week 12 of Semester 2/2013, hence this expenses is based on the total funding from Pro-Vice Chancellor Office (\$1,026.25), which solely for the purposes of SIP.
- **4.** Due to the uncertainties listed in 1-4, the total expenditure is subject to changes as well.
- **5.** This amount is the net gains solely for the financial year 2013. The ISD for the year 2012 handed down a total amount of \$4,042.95. Hence, the total expected cash at bank by the end of year 2013 would be



**\$4,848.84**(\$4,042.95+\$795.89). This amount will subject to change due to estimations and assumptions listed above.

# **Meetings and Advocacy**

### **ANU Mental Health Working Group**

The final report for the ANU Mental Health Working Group has been drafted and approved by the Student Experience Committee.

Special mention must be given to 2013 ANUSA President - Aleksandra Sladojevic - for her excellent leadership in guiding the working group this year. The Mental Health Framework, Strategy and Operational Plan will definitely be of great benefit to a lot of students.

The ISD pushed strongly for the Framework, Strategy and Operational Plan to recognise diversity in the ANU Community which they did.

### **Student Experience Committee (SEC)**

The last was held on Friday 18 October 2013. The ANU Mental Health Working Group final report was discussed and approved.

The Committee discussed and approved the proposal by Professor Richard Baker to explore an internship program for students where the University will recognise relevant internships students engage in.

PARSA brought up a need to explore further accommodation issues for international students, in particular post-graduates who seek to acquire properties in ACT to stay in during their degree here.

ISD called for stronger attention to be directed towards empowering the DRCC to provide stronger legal support for off-campus ANU students.

The ANUSA International Officer/ISD President was invited to attend the Laurus Wing end of year dinner on 18 October 2013 at the University House.


