 - Discussion paper I need to reconvene- 12 unit thesis and an extra 36 points of research work, looking at building into electives like a graduated scheme, extra workload within that elective. We are appreciative of them doing what they can to keep it within a 5 year degree.
 - o **Dallas Proctor**: 70% GPA, 30% thesis,
 - Sascha Silberstein: has there been any discussion about why GPA is so focused on GPA. You may work really hard. That's how they get around having it in their degree
 - o **Amanda Joyce-Neilson:** Letting people know that in first year that your GPA matters for honours
 - o **Ali French:** Good thing about AQF, it will make the college reassess how they inform students about honours
 - Ali French: It is publicly available, making it more known.
 Sascha Silberstein: philosophy, you could think about honours
 - Alex: with honours GPA, drop the lowest 3 marks off your GPA, ew AQF it could come to the point they will have to chose betwee exchange and honours.
 - o Harry Wall: are you trying to make it that electives do count?
 - o Ali French: trying to work through and figure out
 - **Sam Teong:** if the change does go through it has to be done by 2015.

- We mostly discussed what kind of transparency structures the university has in place when cutting staff (teachers with low research output)
- He told us things we should be looking into:
 - Ed com reports were confidential- are they made public, analysis of SELT, should ANUSA undertake independent analysis.
 - o Actual spreadsheet is confidential, the report is in real terms
 - They can't publish that as no student would enrol in 30 courses in each college.
 - Similar analysis what's acceptable ground for cuts to be madeteaching quality
 - Reccommended to us: response rates of SELTS, if they have been given out in paper you get a higher response rate.
 - If you were enrolled and did SELT should you receive the feedback?
 - Dallas: Every uni in Australia has the same feedback.
 - o IT deficiencies- cuts in the works for wattle, grossly underfunded and that extends to a majority of IT services.
 - Tom: Mention of staff cuts, possibly cutting a lot of staff to get one high flyer, done mainly in science.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dallas Proctor

Relevant Committees

Since the last CRC, I attended University Education Committee and CAAC (coursework/admissions).

The University has established an Implementation Plan for the Australian Qualification Framework which incorporates the disestablishment of several programs of study. In general, no courses are getting 'cut' through this process, but the names of the degree will be simplified.

Also, double degrees are to become ubiquitous, and new vertical double degrees are being considered.

At CAAC, ATAR bonus points came up as a pertinent discussion topic. A policy is to be finalised on how these will be awarded. Also, the issue of whether there should be a University-wide ATAR floor came up.

University Education Committee discussed opportunities to avoid duplication between the colleges and to encourage research-led education. The Committee also discussed the value in ANUSA's Alternative Course Guide and encouraged this to be broadened to all colleges.

SELT was also discussed; including the results of a confidential spreadsheet that identifies badly-performing courses and actions taken to remedy problems.

School of Music

A campaign has been launched to combat the proposed changes. This was discussed at SRC4.

Congratulations to Jack Hobbs and Yasmin Masri for their outstanding achievements on this issue.

Music School Protests

Most of my time this last fortnight has been occupied with the music school protests. A big thank you to Yasmin Masri, Jack Hobbs and of course Dallas Proctor for the immense work they have put in to the campaign. Also a big thanks to all the ANUSA reps who came out yesterday and worked pretty hard to feed the masses.

Academic Board

I represented ANUSA on Academic Board as Dallas' substitute while he attended the Finance Committee. This Board is quite important as it is the one that Access and Equity and University Education report to. It has a lot to do with ensuring degrees meet the right standard, approving new programs and abolishing old programs.

The VC gave his report which covered: ANU "financial repositioning", Music School and the Federal Budget.

ENGINEERING AND COMPUTER SCIENCE REPORT

We had our first Educational Committee meeting over the break. Lots of interesting discussion regarding AQF compliance, and accrediting certain degrees. Engineering/Asian Studies has only 7 students and may be removed, although with the new framework for dual degrees I don't think this will be a problem. Online education/outreach was discussed with a course like COMP1100. The hugely important role of SELT surveys for shaping course offerings was discussed at great length: some of the committee felt that this was too drastic a step and others felt that it was a welcome change.

Besides that, not much to report. This is Morgan's last CRC, and I'm sorry to see him go. Thanks for a great semester.

COLLEGE OF LAW REPORT

1. Committee Meetings

LLB Committee – will be held on Wednesday 16th May. Will update at CRC.

College Education Committee

CEC was held on Wednesday 2nd May. The main issue was AQF and honours for LLB. The CEC is looking to establish a taskforce to deal with this issue and to work through subjects to ensure they are AQF compliant and conduct the required program reviews.

There was another discussion regarding SELT data. CEC just aired the same concerns regarding poor SELT response. We stated that we would do everything we could to improve this (eg lecture bashing)

There was a JD forum on the 3rd May which was held to provide information regarding JD changes but also included a general exam tips section. The JD staff said LLB students couldn't attend because they wanted it to be just for JD's. LSS Education officer expressed concern that a section of the cohort would be receiving exam tips and another section would miss out – the LSS may, with the help of Stephen Bottomly, run a general exam tips forum for LLB students so that they are not disadvantaged.

College Advisory Board

Unfortunately were we unable to attend this meeting, (COL changed the scheduling of the meeting with short notice) held on the 9th of May. Chris Chynoweth, President of the LSS attended and will give brief us on what happened.

2. Other initiatives

Contracts

As we have previously raised, there were issues with the teaching of the first year Contracts course in 2011. We are following up on the work of last years fac reps as preparations occur for this year's Contracts class (run in Semester 2). It has been difficult to get a time with Stephen Bottomly to discuss this – we will keep trying.

ANIP

The ANIP program is currently unable to be counted towards the LLB. We have received feedback that students in the law school would like to be unable to participate in law-related placements as part of their degree. We have subsequently been investigating the reasons behind not allowing ANIP in the LLB and whether there is any scope for this to be changed. We will be discussing it at LLB Committee this week.

Class Reps

We are moving ahead with preparations to start a system of class representatives in the Law School. We will be discussing the proposal this week at LLB Committee and are currently investigating the best model and system.
