Summary

1. CBE Education Committee 08/2021

1. CBE Education Committee 08/2021 (27 September)

We attended CBE Education Committee 08/2021 on 27/09/2021. The most important items raised in the meeting are presented below:

- Course delivery once restrictions are eased.

The mode of delivery for Semester One 2022 is still unknown. Once the current lockdown is lifted, there will not be a mandate to return to campus. It is still unknown when and/or how international students will return to in-person courses.

- Exam Working Group

The Exam Working Group has produced clear, concise information for the upcoming exam period that will be disseminated to both students and staff. The information will hopefully resolve the common concerns for both students and staff members and include a directory of who to contact in emergency situations.

- CBE Virtual Internship Experience

150 places will be offered for the CBE Virtual Internship Experience at business, government, and community organisations. The internship will last three weeks from 29 November to 17 December 2021. The program is free and not-for-credit and students who have not previously completed an ANU internship program will be prioritised. Students must have completed 48 units by the end of 2021 to be eligible. The applications for the VIE close on 15 October.
